

Cardinal Avery Dulles used six models to describe the facets of the Church. The following activities explore each facet and the Church's role in our world today.

The Church as the Body of Christ

The Church as the Body of Christ comes from St. Paul's letter to the Corinthians (watch [Mr. Potato Head Video](#)).

No one can be Christ in the world alone; we need one another to support one another, to grow together, to love one another, to be in community. Just like a body needs all its parts, we need each other to live out the message of Jesus in the world. We are called to be members of God's family, living the Gospel message in the world today.

The Church as Institution

This model of the Church is the most visible; even non-Catholics know who the Pope is. The institution of the Church ensures that the work of the Church will continue for years to come. After Jesus appointed Peter as the leader of the Church and commissioned the Apostles, and returned to Heaven, it was necessary to answer some important questions: How do you join? How are disagreements solved? When the leader of the Church dies, how is a new leader chosen? (Christ is always the head of the Church.)

The Church as Sacrament

People need visible, tangible signs of God in the world. This is one reason Jesus instituted the sacraments. Like the pouring of water in Baptism, the sharing of bread in Eucharist, and the anointing with oil in Confirmation, the Church also conveys God's presence in the world. It is as Sacrament that we are united in love with God and the heavenly community; and it is in the actions we do together in unity (like the Mass), that we are affirmed in our identity as members of God's family.

The Church as Servant



Jesus washed the disciples' feet and tells us to do the same.
